WORSHIP NOTES FOR SUNDAY, JANUARY 29

Life is not to be valued according to appearances. But such a truism is easier to speak, than to follow. In our society it is always a temptation to look on the outward expression and take it to be a sign of what's really there. Success comes to those who work hard for it and deserve it the most. Prosperity is a token of blessing. Though we know better, we find it hard to resist such conclusions.

The three lessons for this Sunday join in warning the people of God that they should not be confused or intimidated by appearances or by how the larger society values this or that. A faithful hearing and responsiveness to the God of the Bible may not fare so well or look so good in terms of the world's standards of judgment. But what is required and blessed is a community ordered according to the commitments shaped by our gracious covenants with God and attuned with what Paul called the "foolishness" and "weakness" of God.

In the passage from Micah (6: 1-8) Israel, when give a chance, presents its case before the divine court. The questions it raises indicate a thorough misunderstanding of (God's) Yahweh's demands—burnt offerings, calves, rams, oil or (even) eldest child. The categories used by the surrounding culture to determine true religion are totally inappropriate to Yahweh. What God wants is nothing less than a refocusing of life—to do justice, to love loyally our covenant with God and to walk humbly with our God.

Paul in his lesson (1 Corinthians 1: 18-31) argues eloquently that the gospel looks to many like nothing more than weakness and folly. The cross symbolizes defeat, an anathema to a success-oriented society, but is really the instrument of power and salvation. It is just God's way to take the low and despised, the weak and the foolish, to confound the wise and mighty.

Finally, the Beatitudes (Matthew 5: 1-12) describe the direction of God's blessing. Surprisingly, it is the poor in spirit, the meek, those hungering for justice, the merciful, the peacemakers and those persecuted for righteousness who are the apple of God's eye, singled out for blessing.

Micah 6: 1-8

Hear what the Lord says: Rise, plead your case before the mountains, and let the

hills hear your voice. Hear, you mountains, the controversy of the Lord, and you

enduring foundations of the earth; for the Lord has a controversy with his people,

and he will contend with Israel.

"O my people, what have I done to you? In what have I wearied you? Answer me!

For I brought you up from the land of Egypt, and redeemed you from the house of

slavery; and I sent before you Moses, Aaron, and Miriam.

O my people, remember now what King Balak of Moab devised, what Balaam son

SECOND LESSON

1 Corinthians 1: 18-31

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."

Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God. He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

THIRD LESSON

Matthew 5: 1-12

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his

disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

"Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

"Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.

"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

"Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the

kingdom of heaven.

"Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of

evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is

great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before

you.
